Healthy goals: Growing up in Ghana, West Africa, twins Alfred and Godfred Mantey recognized the link between poverty and health early on. "Being surrounded by these issues gave us the urge to help people through better healthcare," says Godfred. "We have the opportunity to study here and feel like it is our responsibility to gain the knowledge and skills we need to help others back home."

Where they are now: Godfred is a student in UC's James L. Winkle College of Pharmacy, while Alfred is studying for the MCAT exam, conducting research at UC's Academic Health Center and shadowing physicians on UC Medical Center's trauma team.

Best advice: "It's hard to actually take the first step toward a dream," Alfred says. "But the first step is the most important. Ours was UC Clermont."



Major: Pre-Business, Marketing Management Technology





Financial Aid

Scholarships

UC and UC Clermont offer three types of scholarships: Cincinnatus, Merit, and donor-based. Scholarships are available to new college students, transfers and adult learners in a variety of academic programs. Cincinnatus requires the application, transcripts and ACT scores be at UC by Dec. 1 for consideration. Merit and donor award requirements and deadlines are posted at ucclermont.edu.

Tuition Guarantee

Beginning in Fall 2019, the University of Cincinnati is proud to introduce the Cincinnati Tuition Guarantee for new, degree-seeking first-year and transfer students. The Cincinnati Tuition Guarantee for incoming undergraduate students guarantees a set amount for base tuition. That means incoming undergraduate classes will never know an increase in their base tuition when completing a two, four or five-year degree.

Implementation of the Cincinnati Tuition Guarantee is subject to the parameters established by the Ohio Department of Higher Education and the Ohio Revised Code.
