

AGREEMENT FOR THE ARTICULATION
BETWEEN
UNIVERSITY OF CINCINNATI – CLERMONT COLLEGE
PROGRAM AREA: CRIMINAL JUSTICE TECHNOLOGY
AND
GRANT CAREER CENTER
PROGRAM AREA: LAW ENFORCEMENT
AND
AFFILIATED SCHOOL DISTRICTS

PURPOSE: To establish program requirements and procedures for a close working relationship between the above institutions in order to implement a well-coordinated technical education program leading to an Associate of Applied Science with a major in Criminal Justice Technology.

PROGRAM: The program is designed to include two years of secondary school participation preceding graduation as a recognized Law Enforcement student followed by at least two years of higher education.

Secondary School Portion of the Program

- 1) To gain admission to the University of Cincinnati – Clermont College, applicants must meet the following criteria:
 - a. Completion of the 2 year Law Enforcement Program with a minimum 3.0 GPA
 - b. Completion of 2-Person Professional Rescue CPR Course and certification
 - c. High School graduation with a minimum 2.5 GPA
 - d. 95% attendance

Postsecondary Portion of the Program

- 1) Application to the Program: Law Enforcement students must follow the current Clermont College Admissions / Application process and timeframes.
- 2) Postsecondary Pathway: The college component is provided in Appendix B. Policies and procedures governing college credit opportunities are provided in the following sections.
- 3) College Credit Opportunities for Law Enforcement: The following opportunities are in place for students to receive college credit for the advance course work completed in the secondary portion of the program

College Credit for secondary school certification Students will receive college credit for the college-level work completed in the secondary portion of the program through the following process of the approved secondary teacher:

Law Enforcement Checksheets. Checksheets which secondary career technical education students enrolled in the Law Enforcement Program career major at Grant Career Center complete during their career preparation training.

High School Transcript. The Transcript will indicate that the student has completed the Law Enforcement block with a GPA of 3.0 or better.

Meeting with Clermont College Criminal Justice Advisor. Students will meet with the Criminal Justice Academic Advisor at Clermont College to determine eligibility for granting of advanced college credit.

- A. **College Credit with Successful College Performance**. After completion of 24 semester credit hours of study at the University of Cincinnati – Clermont College, and an overall 2.0 GPA, the student will receive college level credit for the following courses:

4. Timeframe for Honoring Course By-Pass and College Credit Opportunity. Students will matriculate at the University of Cincinnati – Clermont College within 1 year of graduation from high school. If the student enters the armed forces of the United States directly after high school graduation and is assigned to a Military Occupation Specialty related to law enforcement or security, the matriculation timeframe is 36 – 48 months. Timeframe depends on length of service.
5. The Associate Degree in Criminal Justice Technology can transfer into the University of Cincinnati College of Education & Criminal Justice Program's baccalaureate degree

This Agreement is in effect for one year of the date of signing, at which time may review and recommend modifications




