

# **Articulation Agreement**

**Associate of Arts (AA): Pre-Business Administration  
at UC Clermont College**

**to**

**Bachelor of Science in Business Administration (BSBA)  
at the Haile/US Bank College of Business, Northern Kentucky University**

(Updated for Academic Year 2018-19)

## **General Information**

### **Purpose**

This Agreement establishes a partnership between Northern Kentucky University and UC Clermont College for the purpose of providing students a well-defined and fully integrated pathway from initial postsecondary enrollment to the Associate of Arts: Pre-Business Administration degree to the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration degree.

### **NKU Degrees/Programs Covered in this Agreement**

All academic progression plans in this Agreement apply only to students who successfully complete all requirements and are awarded the Associate of Arts degree at UC Clermont College, and thus satisfy all General Education requirements at Northern Kentucky University. Students who do not complete the AA degree before transferring must satisfy General Education requirements at NKU on a course-by-course equivalency basis.

Bachelor of Science in Business Administration major tracks included in this Agreement are:

- Accounting
- Entrepreneurship
- Finance
- General Business
- Global Supply Chain Management
- Human Resource Management
- International Business
- Management
- Marketing
- Sports Business and Event Management

### **Provisions for Review, Revision and Catalog of Record Designation**

Both parties agree to review this Agreement on an annual basis on or about the release of their respective academic catalogs for the forthcoming academic year, and to make any necessary updates required by curricular changes.

To avoid disadvantaging students at UC Clermont College who have formally begun the four year progression outlined in this document, students enrolling at Northern Kentucky University with an earned AA degree from UC Clermont College will be permitted to designate their catalog of record up to two years before the year of NKU enrollment, if such designation is to their advantage.

#### Benefits for Students Provided by Northern Kentucky University

The Haile/US Bank College of Business and Northern Kentucky University will make the benefits listed below available to students of UC Clermont College who have formally declared their intent to earn the AA degree and subsequently pursue the BSBA degree at Northern Kentucky University.

- Access to online or on-campus advising from a Haile/US Bank College of Business professional advisor while enrolled at UC Clermont College before entering NKU.
- Guidance from Haile/US Bank College of Business faculty and advisors in selection of BSBA major and related career opportunities while enrolled at UC Clermont College before entering NKU.
- [Pending: partner will be notified when available] Access to transfer student-only merit scholarships awarded by both the College and the University. (Award of scholarships is competitive and cannot be guaranteed.)
- First semester transfer student-only orientation program presented by the Haile/US Bank College of Business (in addition to and does not replace NKU general transfer orientation requirements).
- Priority access to the Haile/US Bank College of Business *Executive Mentor Program* (not available to Online majors).
- Priority access to the Haile/US Bank College of Business *Hired! Haile Growth Partnership Program* (not available to Online majors).

#### Benefits for Students Provided by UC Clermont College

The University of Cincinnati's Clermont College will make the benefits listed below available to students at UC Clermont College who have formally declared their intent to earn the Associate of Arts degree at Clermont College.

- Access to an orientation program and academic advising from the Advising Center at Clermont College during the completion of the associate's degree
- Guidance from Clermont College faculty and advisors regarding course selection, professional development, career opportunities and transfer expectations
- Access to scholarships while enrolled at Clermont College (Award of scholarships is competitive and cannot be guaranteed).

#### Additional Partnership Commitments

All parties to this Agreement commit to the following in order to enhance the success of our students:

- Frequent communication at all levels.
- Collaboration in instructional rigor and content to ensure that students are well-prepared for upper division coursework.
- Sharing aggregated student data and analytics concerning relevant student experiences and outcomes.

#### Cancellation and Expiration

This Agreement may be cancelled by the chief academic officer of either institution by providing written notice to the other at least one academic semester prior to the effective date of termination.

This Agreement will be considered continuous for five (5) years from the date of signing unless revision or cancellation is requested by either party. The Agreement will expire after five (5) years unless renewed by agreement of both parties.

## **Curriculum (AY 2018-19 Academic Catalog)**

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy the requirements under the AY 2018-19 academic catalog for the AA degree at UC Clermont College and leads to the BSBA degree in the Haile/US Bank College of Business at Northern Kentucky University.

Northern Kentucky University recognizes the completion of General Education certification requirements at any U.S. regionally accredited institution of higher education as fulfilling NKU General Education certification requirements. Table 1 (following) makes specific course stipulations in the General Education block where those specified courses will also fulfill Haile/US Bank College of Business BSBA requirements.

### **Additional Admission Requirements for BSBA Majors:**

The BSBA is a selective admission program. All BSBA students enter as pre-majors (e.g., Accounting Pre-Major) prior to earning full admission to the major (e.g., Accounting Major).

BSBA pre-majors must complete each of the six designated selective admission courses (ACC 200, ACC 201, BUS 230, ECO 200, ECO 201, and MKT 205, or approved equivalents) in the BSBA Business Core with a grade of C- or better and earn an overall NKU GPA of 2.500 or better to be admitted into any BSBA major. All transfer students must complete a minimum of 12 credit hours at NKU (in any combination of courses) in order to establish an NKU GPA before applying for admission to the BSBA major.

Students transferring to NKU from UC Clermont College must earn a minimum grade of C- in each of the following transferred UC Clermont College courses in order to meet selective admission requirements without having to repeat equivalent courses at NKU: ACCT 2081, ACCT 2082, BLAW 2080, MKTG 2080, ECON 1001, ECON 1002.

Students transferring credit for ACC 200 Principles of Accounting I-Financial are not required to complete ACC 200L Financial Accounting Lab (1 credit).
