**Operating Institution:** University of Cincinnati Clermont College  
**Degree/Program:** Associate of Arts or Associate of Science

**Target Institution:** Northern Kentucky University  
**Degree/Program:** Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education, Middle Grades Education, or Secondary Education

**Introduction:** This agreement details the applicability\* of courses from the Associate of Arts or Associate of Science Degree from UC Clermont College (UCCC) to the Bachelor of Arts in Education degree program in Elementary Education, Middle Grades Education, or Secondary Education at Northern Kentucky University.

The acceptability\* of credit to the University is determined by the central credit evaluation process. The purpose of this agreement and its appendices is to describe which of those acceptable credits apply to requirements in this particular college and major at Northern Kentucky University.

\*Applicable transfer courses satisfy degree requirements for graduation. The purpose of this Transfer Articulation Agreement is to identify courses that will apply toward degree requirements.

\*\*Acceptable transfer courses meet all UC requirements and credit is granted. Acceptable credit that does not satisfy a student's degree requirements is accepted as free elective credit.

**Articulation Overview:** Graduates from UC Clermont College who have followed the prescribed program and have completed the Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will be accepted as transfer students in the College of Education and Human Services at Northern Kentucky University. To be admitted to an education program students must meet the following criteria:

**Admission Requirements for Elementary Education:**  
 Student must earn a minimum overall average GPA 2.75; Praxis Core scores in reading 156, writing 162, and math 150; a successful FBI fingerprint check; 45 semester hours completed; an acceptable portfolio; and a completed application to the education program must be on file.

The Agreement acknowledges the UC Clermont College courses listed in the attached sheets will be accepted under the current admission policy of the College of Education and Human Services at Northern Kentucky University.

Appropriate parties from each institution shall review the Transfer Curriculum Guides and Articulation Agreement to determine if any alterations should be considered for the next academic year.

The deans of both colleges will agree upon any future additions and/or amendments to this document in writing.

This agreement will be reviewed on an annual basis and is subject to change due to revisions in program curriculum and state licensure requirements. Students at UC Clermont College are encouraged to work closely with their academic advisor to monitor possible changes.


